## **Project List**

#### 1. Timeline Poster:

Create a timeline of the story's important events on a poster board. The timeline must be in chronological order and have at least 10 points; each point must have an illustration and a short summary.

### 2. Book Jacket:

Make a book jacket.

Front: Design (either on a computer or drawn) a new cover for the book. Be sure to include the title and the author

Inside left: Write at least three critic reviews saying what you liked or three things you disliked about the book.

Back cover: Write a summary that would catch a reader's attention and make them want to read the book. Do not just copy what the back of the book already says; make up your own!

### 3. Diorama

Make a shoebox diorama with an important scene in the book. On the back, write a paragraph summarizing the scene and another three paragraphs explaining why it's important to the overall story. Make sure to include what led to this scene and then what ultimately happened as a result of this scene.

#### 4. Interview with a Character

Pick a character from your book and interview them. Compile a list of questions that will take the reader through the events of the story. Answer the questions as the character you selected. In answering these questions, be sure to make a coherent summary of the story and also give some insight into the character's thoughts and feelings about the events that took place.
